

## **Books and Badges Helps Boost Literacy**

The Sarasota Housing Authority, in partnership with the Sarasota Police Department, the Book Rich Environments collaborative, and Sarasota County Libraries held the annual Books and Badges literacy event on Thursday.

The event commemorated the Campaign for Grade Level Reading's National Summer Learning Week by providing free books for children from lower income families. The program aims to reduce "summer learning loss" — an educational decline that can happen when children are out of school — while providing positive interaction with police, who handed out the books, to improve relationships and trust between Sarasota Police and families in public housing, a news release stated. "Two of our core passions at the Sarasota Housing Authority are early childhood education and building trust between our families and local law enforcement. Books and Badges moves the needle on both issues and we are excited to bring this back to our community this year," said William Russell, CEO of the Sarasota Housing Authority.
